This monumental—and entertaining—series depicts a single sprawling narrative of a post-apocalyptic world in which all of history is lost. Endres' paintings recount the pivotal events and figures of this fictional history, while offering a satirical take on our own.

With the heroes and villains of Endres' 2014 exhibition *Theater of War* now absent from post-disaster Boston, a new chapter of the saga is set to unfold. In the midst of a power vacuum, the celebutante Octavian the Pale has stumbled into the stewardship of New Boston. A veritable Peter Pan, Octavian promises everlasting youth to the renegade bands of "Lost Boys" who follow him. All is well until a faithful disciple sprouts a single gray hair, calling years of lies into question.

Equal parts comedy and tragedy, *The L#ST B#YS* offers a fascinating examination of mythmaking, mortality, polarities, and the fictional nature of history. Welcome to Burden America, Year 15 P.B.



Chris Ellis (American, b. 1962)—best known by his street name, Daze—began writing graffiti in the New York City subway in the mid-1970s. Hailed as one of the most important graffiti artists of his generation, Daze turned to canvas in the early 1980s, successfully making the transition from street to studio. In 1981 his work was featured in the Mudd Club group exhibition Beyond Words, alongside work by Jean-Michel Basquiat and Keith Haring. Using spray paint in combination with acrylic and oil, Daze's paintings capture the grittiness and spontaneous energy of city life. Daze has exhibited internationally and his work can be found in the permanent collections of The Museum of Modern Art, The Brooklyn Museum, The Museum of the City of New York, Yale University Art Gallery, and The Addison Gallery of American Art.



# Ruth Eckstein: Abstract Modernist

Abstract modernist painter and master printmaker **Ruth Eckstein** (1916–2011) has received international recognition for her refined organic abstractions. Her pared-down compositions layer flat planes of color and texture, balancing simplified forms and gentle color harmonies to create a remarkable sense of tranquility.

After fleeing Nazi Germany in 1934, Eckstein immigrated first to Paris and finally to New York in 1939. Her life and work intersected with a number of influential figures in post-war American art, including Hans Hofmann, Stuart Davis, Harry Sternberg, and printmaker Seong Moy. Eckstein's work is represented in over fifty prestigious public collections, including the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, the Museum of Modern Art, the Guggenheim Museum, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Whitney Museum of American Art.


This year we are excited to introduce the graphic work of contemporary artist Sean Flood.
