

R.H. Ives Gammell: Visual Philosopher

JANUARY 14 - MARCH 12, 2016

R.H. Ives Gammell: Visual Philosopher presents the largest known collection of paintings by American Realist painter **R.H. Ives Gammell** (1893–1981) in private hands. One of the last American artists to receive classical training and a former student of William M. Paxton, Gammell was influential as a mentor who imparted the classical ideals of The Boston School to future generations of artists. Gammell's imaginative paintings explore the complexities of human experience through the visual languages of Classical Realism and personal symbolism. This unique collection of Gammell's portraits, landscapes, and allegorical paintings reveals both the artist's versatility and his singular vision of the world.

The Art of Scandal: What Might Isabella Stewart Gardner Collect Today?

MARCH 16 - MAY 14, 2016

What was so scandalous about the 19th century art collector Isabella Stewart Gardner? "Immortalized by Henry James in print and by John Singer Sargent on canvas, Isabella Stewart Gardner has remained an elusive original whose independent life and work shocked the Boston aristocracy she married into," writes Douglass Shand-Tucci in his captivating biography of the famed "Mrs. Jack," *The Art of Scandal*.

Adds the celebrated museum that bears her name, "The local press was both fascinated and scandalized by her," not just by Gardner's flouting of social conventions, but also the audacity of building a 15th century Venetian-style palazzo in Boston to house "one of the most remarkable and intimate collections of art in the world today" – and one open to the public! "Isabella Gardner installed her collection of works in a way to evoke intimate responses to the art, mixing paintings, furniture, textiles, and objects from different cultures and periods among well-known European paintings and sculpture," and therein lies her true genius.

With *The Art of Scandal*, Childs Gallery projects Gardner's life and spirit onto today's art world, daring to imagine what she might collect were she still alive today. The exhibition features paintings, photographs, and prints by contemporary artists Alex Katz, Abelardo Morell, Erik Desmazières, Raphael Jaimes-Branger, Michael Bergt, Anthony Moore, and Adam Van Doren, among others. Gardner's love of religious and classical imagery, Venice, Asian exoticism, and technical bravura is apparent throughout, with many works inspired by Gardner's own collection, including paintings by Sargent, Whistler, and the masters of the Italian Renaissance.

The exhibition marks the publication of the new and expanded edition of Douglass Shand-Tucci's biography, *The Art of Scandal: The Life and Times of Isabella Stewart Gardner*.

Anne Lyman Powers: Seven Decades of Painting

MAY 19 - JULY 9, 2016

Anne Lyman Powers was born in 1922, and raised in Boston, Massachusetts. An early interest in the arts led her to study at various institutions, including the Winsor School, Vassar College, Columbia University, and the progressive School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston where she studied with Boston Expressionist Karl Zerbe. Over her 70 year career as an artist, Powers' subject matter has ranged from politically charged material to bucolic landscapes.

For Powers, the pleasure and interest she takes in painting is derived from the tension that exists between realism and abstraction—"realist abstraction or abstract realism". By striving to marry these two aspects, Powers seeks to "make possible and enhance a feeling, an experience or a statement about the world…or about the human condition".



Félix Buhot's prints are known for their originality in composition and technique. By combining multiple processes of traditional printmaking with experimentation in inking and papers, Buhot produced highly unique, atmospheric works. His introduction of symphonic margins, small vignettes layered around a larger scene, further solidified the artist's reputation as one of the most innovative printmakers of the late 19th century.

Based on the very successful exhibition of **Erik Desmazières'** prints and drawings at the Musée Jenisch in Vevey, Switzerland, *Imaginary Places* explores a number of important themes in the artist's work: Cities, Battles, Explorations, Curiosities, Comedies, Chambers of Wonders and Libraries. Recalling the technical virtuosity of the Old Masters, Desmazières' prints are beautifully skillful in detailing both the profoundly real and the absurdly surreal. Whether depicting familiar cities and scenes or wholly invented fantasy realms, the artist employs his idiosyncratic perspective to envision spaces that are at once both familiar and dreamlike.
